I can't quite believe that we are approaching the end of the first half term at school. This week the children have enjoyed learning all about autumn. This is such a beautiful season to explore as it brings a wealth of language opportunities. What have we been up to this week?

- We started our week reading the story of The Gruffalo's child. We looked closely at the illustrations and made charcoal drawings just like those found in the Gruffalo cave.
- We loved sharing and talking about our bags of autumn treasure what a wonderful range of nature we had. We examined and described the treasure and then used non-fiction books to found out what our treasure was called.
- We explored colour mixing by making funky handprint hedgehogs.
- We took advantage of the beautiful sunshine earlier in the week and got out our solar powered water sprinkler. We used our science brains to work out how it actually worked and tested our ideas by making shadows to block the light.
- In maths we have been learning about sorting into sets and describing the sets.
- The school photographer took our pictures on Tuesday and we can confirm that all children had beautiful smiles.
- I hope you all loved your child's cauliflower card design that was brought home this week. A reminder that orders need to be placed online before half term and all artwork needs to be returned to school by 30th October (in time to be sent to the printers)


Next week we will be...


- Continuing with our learning about autumn with a focus on harvest.
