The children have continued to settle amazingly well at school. They are showing great independence in the mornings; putting away their own bag, water bottle and coat. Now that the children have settled in, I would like run a series of EYFS workshops which you may find useful in supporting your child at home. These meetings will take place in our classroom (Reception Class will be having fun in the hall). Please arrive via the school office. During this meeting, we will discuss the day to day routines in Reception as well as our curriculum.

<u>Thursday 19th October at 2.00 – 2.50pm. Reading and Phonics.</u>

This meeting will give an overview of how we teach reading through phonics and also give some ideas of how to support your child with reading at home.

What have we been up to this week?

- On Tuesday we visited the school library for the first time. We used our gentle voices and learned how to behave in a library. We know that books are precious and we took care when handling and choosing one to take home.
- We have been reading stories about The Creation (Genesis 1). Click on this link to watch a lovely animation: https://youtu.be/bLHB_hNk42g
 The children made beautiful planet earths from paper plates they are bringing these home. Please talk to your child about their lovely learning.
- We have offered the children the opportunity to play in the big KS1 playground at lunchtime. Six children are selected each day and get to wear a special orange bib. This is of course optional for the children.
- On Wednesday we found a note on Mrs Evans' chair announcing a 'mystery reader' would be coming to read a story at the end of the day. We waited for three knocks on our classroom door and we were delighted to welcome Mrs Ferryman.
- We continued to learn our golden rules; Kind hands, Kind feet, Kind words. It would be amazing if the children could practise using this vocabulary at home too.
