For an ongoing Science project that builds on our prior learning about classification, you will focus on the living things in your local area and how things change as the seasons begin to change. New resources for you to use to develop your project will be in the fortnightly emails. I'd like you to observe both plants and animals (including insects) in your local habitat. This could be your garden, a local park, some nearby woodlands, whatever is close and accessible to you.) You will identify how the habitats change as Spring develops (you may have already noticed some new plants, flowers, trees, even birds). You will use your classification skills to sort plants and leaves as these will be some of the most noticeable changes over the coming weeks. All resources sent via email.

Maths

Every day you will need to look at the daily Maths video on White Rose. You must then complete the activities and ask someone at home to mark it. Your parents will have received an email with all daily tasks. There will be extra maths challenges for you to complete each day and you should attempt some of these. Tasks will consist of:

- Arithmetic tests for you to complete and mark yourself.
- Text book—work will be set daily, but you can complete in any order. Knowledge cards with facts to learn

Our theme for this two week block is 'Serving'

- Week 1: Think about times when we have been called to serve others. How can we show our service to others, especially at this time? What do you think service means? Write your thoughts and ideas in your learning journal.
- Week 2: Look at the PDF prezi of Pentecost. Think about the questions and look at the painting. Then, using your imagination, complete this piece writing. Pretend that you are a servant looking after the people in the upper room. You bring them food and drink, and wonder why they are so sad. One day, you creep into the room and witness something incredible. Describe this using your senses and explain what you think is the significance of the events.

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GEOGRAPHY

- Lesson 2—locating counties and cities of the United Kingdom, geographical regions and their identifying human and physical characteristics and features (including hills, mountains, coasts and rivers), and land-use patterns; I will explore how some of these aspects have changed over time.
