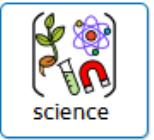

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Eye	The part of the body that people see with	
Ear	The part of the body people hear with	
Hear	When we listen to sounds	
Sweet	Having a taste that is sugary	
Sour	Having a tangy taste	
Salty	Having a taste of salt	
Bitter	Having a sharp taste	
Savoury	Having a taste that is not sweet	
Skin	The part of the body that senses touch	

Rough	An uneven surface	
Smooth	An even surface	
Hard	When a material does not bend or stretch easily	
Soft	When a material does not feel rough or hard	
Nose	The part of the body used to smell	
Smell	To sense something through the nose	
Scent	A smell left by an object	
Sniff	To breathe in a smell	
Stench	A smell that is strong and unpleasant	

sight	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We need light to see. Glasses help some people see clearly. Our two eyes work together. 	
taste	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The tongue is in the mouth. It is covered in taste buds. The five basic tastes are sweet, savoury, salty, bitter and sour. 	
smell	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Some smells are nice, like the smell of flowers. Some smells are not so nice, like the smell of dirty socks! 	
hearing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We can describe sound using words like loud or quiet, high or low and shout and whisper. 	
touch	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Our skin allows us to feel things. We often use our hands to touch.
