

Using different types of adverb

We have largely understood adverbs as *'words that end in -ly which give more detail about a verb'*. All adverbs modify a verb, but there are many different types. The adverbs below have all been used in the passage you will read today (Chapter 3, p106).

Adverbs of manner – tell us **how** something is done. Grandad spoke **angrily**.

Adverbs of time – tell us **when** something is done He contacted Mr Broom **immediately**.

Adverbs of place – tell us **where** something is done. Mr Broom will come **here**.

Adverbs of degree – tell us the **amount** that something is done. He was **very** interested.

Adverbs of frequency – tell us how often something is done. They **rarely** looked at each other.

Adverbs of certainty – tell us **how certain** we are about how something is done. It **probably** wasn't important.
