Feed on flower nectar and pollen.

Are flying, hairy bodied insects with 6 legs, 2 pairs of wings and 5 eyes!

Communicate through chemical scents called pheromones and through special dances.

There are nearly 20,000 known species.

Have 2 stomachs.
One for eating and one for storing nectar.

3 types can be found in a hive: The Queen who runs the whole hive and lays eggs, the Workers who forage for food, build, protect and Clean the hive and the Drones (the males) who's job is to mate with the Queen.

The honey species live in hives and are best known for producing sticky, sweet-tasting honey.

Flap their wings up to 200 times per second, which makes their distinctive buzz sound.

Can live in any location that that grows insect-pollinated flowering plants.

Sting when threatened.

Are the only insect in the world that make

food for humans.
