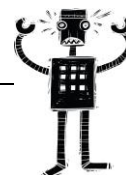


Big Writing Feedback

Great work, Year 3!</p>	<p><u>Grammar Error</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Forgetting to use a comma after a fronted adverbial 2. To use did and done correctly: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Today, I did something (simple past tense) • Today, I have done something (present perfect tense) • Today, I was doing (past progressive tense) 3. To recognise where you need to use 'an' 4. To use a capital for the pronoun 'I'
<p><u>Green for Growth:</u> Can you choose two adjoining sentences from your diary that you think are the weakest of your piece of writing. Can you have a go at re-writing them, to improve them?</p>	<p><u>Common Spelling Errors:</u> Someth<u>ing</u> everyone built capt<u>ure</u> <u>th</u>ing excited thr<u>ough</u></p>
<p><u>Areas for whole class feedback – composition and effect.</u> The best diary entries used paragraphs, had a mixture of short and longer sentences and were clear throughout in explaining how Hogarth felt. Everyone has made progress from where they were though. 😊</p>	<p><u>Tickled Pink:</u> Some great <u>vocabulary</u> – lured, despite, wonder, proud etc.</p> <p><u>Punctuation</u> I've spotted used correctly: capital letters, full stops, exclamation marks, question marks, ellipsis, commas after fronted adverbials, apostrophes for contractions, commas in a list, apostrophes for possession, inverted commas for speech. Wow!</p> <p>A fantastic variety of conjunctions used.</p>
