ACTIVITY IDEAS FOR ALL CHILDREN

- Draw the Earth cut in half so that you can see all the layers inside. Colour and label each layer and see if you can learn the names of each one (Earth Model sheet, layers of the Earth interactive)
- Design a planet of your own. What would it look like? What features would it have? What colour would it be? What signs of life would it have? Who would live there? (**Design a Planet sheet**)
- Write a song about our wonderful planet, using some of the facts you have learnt. Record your masterpiece or perform it to someone in your family.
- Make an Earth mini book. You could fill it with facts about the Earth or the Solar System.
- Be the teacher teach someone in your family all about Planet Earth based on the new knowledge you have. You could even give them a little test at the end © (Knowledge Organiser)
- Complete one of the reading activities about Planet Earth (Read and Colour KS1, Earth, Moon and Sun KS1/2, Reading Comprehension KS2)
- Look at this 3D model of Planet Earth, it's amazing! click here
- Make a paper plate Planet Earth using coloured paper or tissue
- Write a paragraph about Planet Earth based on your research. You could illustrate your work too.
- Get creative by completing a piece of artwork with Planet Earth as the theme.
