## DT activities for all children

### 1. Design and make a bug hotel.

A bug hotel is a sheltered purpose built structure that provides a safe environment for those bugs to live in. Bug hotels offer children a handful of learning opportunities, it is a great project for children to be involved in and learn more about their natural environment.

### 2. Make a bird feeder for your garden.

If you think that having bird houses, bird baths or bird feeders in the garden are purely for decorative purposes then think again. There are many reasons why you should try and attract birds to your garden: they keep the insect population under control in your garden. They can be something of a natural pesticide for your garden. Smaller birds that drink nectar from the flowers are responsible for cross pollination in the garden, again very good for your garden.

### 3. Create a recipe for small animals.
