Mission

Throughout our lives we all have different missions which we face in terms of our learning, our faith and our own personal lives. Our mission in terms of the Church is to go out into the world and spread the Good News of Jesus.

1) Start by lighting a candle a writing the word mission on a piece of paper. Play some music in the background and note down words or draw pictures that the word 'mission' makes you think of. Our mission is to live as Jesus would want us to, to share His Good News and live as a disciple.

- 2) Read together story of Jesus beginning his mission- Luke 4:14-22. https://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=luke+4%3A14-22&version=ICB
- 3) Key questions:
 - What does the word mission mean to you?
 - What has Jesus inspired you to do?
 - How can you help others?
 - What can you do in your daily life? What special action can you take?
- 4) Choose an activity from below as a follow up task:
 - Create a kindness tree and every time you share Jesus' message, add this to the tree
 on a leaf.
 - Write a letter to a friend or family member explaining to them about Jesus' Good News and his message.
 - Read our Mission Statement and think about how you live this out in your life at school.
 Present this in a leaflet, poster, letter, diary or any other way you want.

- Share a random act of kindness with someone you know who needs some extra thought.
- Write a prayer to Jesus asking for His help and guidance in your life.
- Research into a charity: What do they do? Who do they help? How can we help? For example CAFOD, Missio, RSPCA, NSPCC.
- 5) Go back to the piece of paper you used at the start. Add any words or pictures as you want. Read the prayer together: We adore you, Jesus and we praise and thank you for your living among us. We ask you to walk beside us as they seek to proclaim your Gospel. Cherish, guide, and strengthen us; help us to be patient when we meet frustrations, and encourage us when we are disappointed. Amen.
