Sunday Afternoon by George Seurat

Seurat painted for a time with the Impressionist painters, Claude Monet, Renoir, Sisley and Pissarro. His scientific ideas about colour then led him to develop a different painting technique. He painted in tiny dots of colour, with the theory that the viewer's eye would mix them. This technique is called "pointillism".



Art Ideas for all Children

- Download a colouring and instead of shading your work use pointillism.
- Draw an outline of something that you like and complete it using finger painting. Your fingers will create the dots.
- Draw something that you like and then use cotton bud to paint it. The cotton bud will create the dots to complete your painting in the stle of pointillism.
- Use a computer or a laptop to create an outline and fill your drawing in with circles or dots.
