# **BEECH CLASS - YEAR 3**

#### Our Very Own Roman Army

Last half term Year 3 studied the fascinating history topic of the Romans. We jumped back 2000 years to explore the powerful Roman Empire and how the Romans invaded and settled all over Europe. One of our favourite projects was creating Roman shields in our DT lessons.

#### Learning and Investigating

The first thing we did was investigate drawings, photographs and carvings of Roman shields to see what they looked like 2000 years ago. We noticed that many of them had a vivid design on them. We learnt that the eagle's wings on most designs were a symbol of the Roman army. The lightning bolts represent their god, **Jupiter**.

Next we thought about what materials we should make our shields from. The Romans made their shields from wood with a round metal boss in the centre. We didn't have these materials so we experimented using different kinds of card to make our shields strong.

#### **Designing and Making**

The next step we took was to design our shields. We had to think about the measurements and how we would hold our shields.

Making the shields was really exciting. It was great to see everyone working together and helping each other create their final piece.

### Tortoise formation

Did you know that the Romans called their shield a scutum?

#### <u>Testing</u>

Finally we got to try out our shields. We took them outside and marched in formation like a real Roman **century** with Miss Hert leading us as a **centurion**.

We then used our shields to create the tortoise (testudo) formation. This is where the first line of soldiers interlocked their shields to make a wall. The soldiers behind them would hold their shields over their heads to form a protective 'shell'. This was very effective against arrow attacks from the enemy!

### **Glossary**

**Jupiter**: The Roman god of the sky, thunder and king of the gods. **Century:** A section of the Roman army made of around 100 men. **Centurion**: An officer in the Roman army and leader of a century.
