

Adverbs, Adverbial Phrases and Fronted Adverbials **Answers**

A range of adverbs could be used to add details about the manner or time of the action in the sentence, for example:

1. Ben ran **yesterday**.
2. She yawned **politely**.
3. I ate my breakfast **greedily**.
4. The ball fell **suddenly**.
5. The room went **eerily** dark.

A range of adverbial phrases could be used to add detail about the time, place or manner of the action in the sentence, for example:

1. Chang whacked the ball **like a professional**.
2. The builders built the house **on the spare land**.
3. It rained **until the morning**.
4. I'm going to a party **at the play centre**.

A range of fronted adverbials could be used to add detail about the time, place or manner of the action in the sentence. They must be followed by a comma, for example:

1. **Tomorrow**, I'm playing tennis.
2. **Since it was messy**, I tidied my room.
3. **Without warning**, the lightning struck the tree.
