Teaching Input					
 Ask the children to tell you the traditional story of Cinderella. As they do, draw a storyboard/map of the key events on a separate board. Now ask the children to re-tell the story of the Egyptian Cinderella as best they can, alongside the story map they have made. Draw an accompanying storyboard to the one you have just made. Begin by focusing on the characters. What is the same and what is different between the two versions of the story? Does each character in the traditional version have an equivalent in the Egyptian version? If so, who are they and how are they similar/different? Now focus on the events by giving them a statement: 'A poor girl marries royalty after she is the only one whose foot fits into a special shoe'. Does this statement fit both stories? What else is similar about the stories? What are the main differences?
