






The Great Exhibition of 1851 was a display of all the wonderful new inventions that had been created. During her reign, Britain came into the steam age. Railways were built and it became easier than ever to travel over long distances. By the time she died in 1901, she was a symbol of British greatness and was much loved by her people.







