Teaching Input

- What do you already know about the River Nile? Children to think, pair, share their ideas then list on the slides.
- Go through the information on the slides giving geographical details of the Nile, including length, tributaries, sources, mouth, etc.
- Go through the questions on the slides to see how much the children have remembered about the information they have just read.
- What do you think the River Nile is used for? Invite children to share their ideas. Show children some of the uses the Nile had during ancient Egyptian times. Which of these uses do you think the Nile still has today?
