

E-safety is an important part of the creative curriculum both in computing lessons and in how we model the use of technology in all areas of learning. Specific guidance is given on what constitutes inappropriate material and what to do if they ever feel uncomfortable or upset about what they see online. Children have access to child-friendly safe search engines such as 'Kiddl' when using the internet and can rely on stringent software to keep them safe online.

PSHE

We follow the diocesan PSHE guidance curriculum which ties in with 'Come & See' RE programme and 'Journey in Love' RSE programme. Children have frequent opportunities to raise & discuss feelings, concerns, ideas and opinions.

Curriculum, learning & teaching – Our curriculum ensures that we offer creative, engaging and challenging learning opportunities for all children. We explore different countries, cultures, traditions and beliefs with parents & visitors supporting the learning by running workshops, talks or teaching sessions. Children are encouraged to explore the local and wider community to learn about the many people who work hard to ensure our safety and quality of life. School trips/visits supplement and enhance all learning opportunities.

Collective worship & assemblies

KS1 children attend all key stage and whole-school assemblies & collective worship including all school Masses in church

KS1 children attend assemblies with EYFS where they talk about the world around them, what makes them special, things to celebrate and how to stay safe. We celebrate our achievements, look at current affairs and major news stories from around the world.

Promoting British Values

British Values underpin our personal, social & emotional development in positive ways through learning about democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, respect and tolerance of different faiths & beliefs. These issues are highlighted particularly during topics focussing on Great Britain, Castles & Knights and Asia. British Values are also an intrinsic element of our RE teaching where we look at saints, other faiths and special festivals across the world.

Our Catholic ethos & values
